

## **Purpose**

Data for equity is achieved when equitable data practices permeate each phase of the data life cycle - from person-centered language and accessibility during the data collection phase, to specific analytic and visualization



techniques during the reporting phase, to strategies applied during ongoing system improvement. This last phase, arguably the most impactful, requires an intentional framework that consists of assessing disparities in 1) access to services; 2) level of services provided; and 3) outcomes. Doing so prompts decisions and interventions that can help close disparity gaps and improve outcomes.
